
The SHIELDS Homeless CalWORKsFamilies Project is a collaboration that exists to assist homeless families in obtaining mental health, employment and permanent housing.



SHIELDS' California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) Mental Health program is designed to locate and stabilize CalWORKs families and remove applicable mental health barriers to their employment. The services we provide consist of **individual/group therapy** which focuses on decreasing mental health symptoms and resolution of intra-psychic conflicts that impedes the client's ability to work, **rehabilitation services** focused on teaching life skills, problem solving and empowerment of clients, **psycho-education, independent life skills, substance abuse and educational/vocational services**. The CalWORKs Homeless Families Project (HCFP) was developed to assist individuals on CalWORKs who are homeless and experiencing mental health barriers to obtaining permanent housing and employment. The services consist of individual/group rehabilitation focused on psycho-education, independent life skills, substance abuse and educational/vocational services. Clients also receive mental health services through the CalWORKs Mental Health Program.

GROW Program

SHIELDS General Relief Opportunities for Work (GROW) provides mental health, employment and training services to help employable General Relief (GR) participants obtain jobs and achieve self-sufficiency.
