

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Functional Family Therapy (FFT





Functional Family Therapy (FFT) is an evidence based short-term family-based prevention and intervention program that provides comprehensive services to at risk/probation youth between 11 - 17 years old and their families.





SHIELDS' Functional Family Therapy (FFT) Program was implemented for youth and families involved with the juvenile justice system in order to decrease risk factors and increase protective factors amongst high risk children and families. Services are offered to probation youth 11 - 17 years old and their families who are struggling with issues related to delinquency, violence, substance

abuse, behavior problems and f a m i l y conflict. SHIELDS' Functional Family Therapy Program has been successful in treating youth and families coping with severe behavioral problems through family therapy, case management and assistance with navigating through the juvenile justice system as well as educational advocacy when applicable. The treatment model has been refined through clinical research for over 30 years. The result, a program that works! Compared to other treatments or to no treatment, youth and family participation in FFT have significantly lower reoccurrence of negative behaviors and/or family conflict. The FFT Program is funded by the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health (DMH).



FFT is a short-term program lasting between 8 to 30 sessions, typically lasting about three months. Sessions are conducted in the home or community setting to the whole family and are provided by trained

and supervised interventionists. The program strives to improve family communication by promoting positive family interactions. It assists family members in adopting positive solutions to family problems by recognizing that they can be related to factors involving school, peers, economic difficulties, and interaction with the juvenile justice system. A major goal of FFT is to utilize the family's strengths to help build positive interactions within the family as well as within the community. The services we provide include family therapy, case management, and assistance with navigating the juvenile justice system. When necessary, educational advocacy is also available. Currently, FFT services are offered within Supervisorial Districts 2 and targets probation and at-risk youth (WIC 236, WIC 654, WIC 652, WIC 602, WIC 790, and WIC 725 status minors) enrolled in several schools and/or housing developments. Youth are referred to the program by the Supervising Deputy Probation Officer responsible for the defined schools and housing developments. In addition, youth who reside in probation suitable placements (group homes) may be referred at the recommendation of the probation residential placement officer.

Program Highlights

- SHIELDS is the largest provider of FFT in the United States.
- The research data consistently shows that youth involved with SHIELDS FFT reduce their negative behavior at rates between 25% and 60%.
- Youth referred to SHIELDS FFT have comparably low dropout rates with a significant percentage of families (around 89%) completing.
